3/50 Project Presentation June 14 at the Arcada Program Supports Local Businesses and Local Economies

On June 14, Cinda Baxter, founder of the 3/50 Project, will discuss the movement to support independent, locally owned businesses and the positive effect this has on the local economy. The presentation will be at the Arcada Theatre, 105 E. Main St. Doors open at 5:00 p.m., with the presentation beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Local, independent business owners and residents are encouraged to attend. The cost is \$10.00, which must be paid in advance by cash or check only, and includes appetizers and refreshments. Please sign up by June 6 at the Downtown St. Charles Partnership, Chamber of Commerce or the City's Economic Development Department.

The 3/50 Project is based on a simple idea: Pick 3 local businesses. Spend \$50 at each. Save your local economy. The Project supports locally owned brick-and-mortar businesses of all types: retail stores, movie theaters, restaurants, dry cleaners, barber shops, etc. Baxter understands many of the challenges encountered by today's independent business owners and will share her hard-earned knowledge and expertise.

Citizen Police Academy Offers Insights into Police Work

Fifteen participants attended this year's Citizen Police Academy conducted by the St. Charles Police Department. Now in its twelfth year, the Academy offers residents, students, businesses and their employees a varied, in-depth look at police work. "Participants learn the ins and outs of the police department, while having the opportunity to interact with officers on a personal level," said Crime Prevention Officer Bill Tynan, who runs the program.

Class topics range from new officer training and SWAT team operations to what officers look for on traffic stops. This year, Judge Clint Hull led a class on how criminal cases proceed through the courts, and Assistant State's Attorney Jody Gleason discussed her office's involvement in criminal proceedings. The class also had many hands-on learning opportunities,

including instruction for handcuffing techniques and the chance to use the Kane County Sheriff's Firearms Training Simulator. The simulator gives a glimpse of what it's like for an officer on the street by placing class members in virtual shoot or don't shoot scenarios through a video program. Participants even witnessed an officer get "Tasered" as part of his certification to carry a Taser device.

"We're always glad to receive very positive feedback from participants," said Tynan. "They say what a great experience it is and that they're happy the City provides this program. Planning already is underway for next year's class, which will be held in March."



Pay Your Utility Bill Online

City of St. Charles utility customers can pay their utility bills online from any checking account and get monthly email notifications when new bills are available for viewing online. An automatic payment option is available as well. To take advantage of online bill pay, simply

log on to the City website at www.stcharlesil.gov and click on the "Utility Bills Online," badge on the right. Then click "Utility Bills Online Log In" and register by entering your utility account number and the last four digits of your phone number. Prevent Storm Flooding



With warmer weather comes the threat of summer storms. Please take these precautions to avoid flooding:

- Do not stack, dump or rake leaves, grass clippings or yard waste into the street or curb line. This could cause street flooding during heavy rains. Instead dispose of these materials with the appropriate yard waste bags.
- Check your roof for missing or curling shingles, and for flashing that is loose or needs to be sealed.
- Be sure gutters and down spouts are clean. Install extensions on down spouts to help drain water away from the building foundation.
- Make sure the ground next to the house has the proper pitch so that surface water is shed away from the foundation.
- Keep trees and bushes trimmed away from the house so when they blow in the wind, they don't cause wear on the roof, siding or trim. Proper pruning also improves airflow and can help prevent moisture problems.

NOTE: Never dispose of liquids into street drains or curb lines as storm inlets drain directly into the river. Notify the Public Works Department at 630-377-4405 if a spill or dumping is observed.

Here Come the Mosquitoes!

Clarke Mosquito Management, Inc., once again will be conducting mosquito control for St. Charles, with the goal to reduce the potential of mosquito-borne disease transmission. Watering Newly Planted Parkway Trees

Every new parkway tree the City's Arbor Team plants receives a "gator bag" slow release watering bag for easy and efficient watering of a newly planted tree. The City will fill it with water at the time of planting and then once again when the landscape is restored.



The City's Arbor Team will be watering newly planted trees about once a month from June through September. If your parkway tree appears thirsty in between these waterings, you may want to refill the bag. Simply lift the white "Tregator" tag to expose the hole in the bag, insert the hose and fill the bag with water. If you have questions, please contact the Public Works Department at 630-377-4405.



Refuse Services Notes

Veolia, the City's refuse contractor, recently began offering a 65-gallon recycling toter for a monthly rental fee of \$3.00. If you're interested, contact them at 630-587-8282 for more information.

Refuse containers that are not Veolia toters must be no larger than 32 gallons and weigh no more than 50 lbs. As a reminder, refuse and recycling containers should be at the curb by 6:00 a.m. Please consider that while refuse and recycling may be picked up the same time most weeks, pick-up times could vary. Please note refuse fees will increase on July 1. July is the only time these fees increase. Refuse and recycling services will remain the same.

Brush Pick Up Schedule

East Side	West Side
June 18	June 25
July 16	July 23
Aug. 20	Aug. 27
Sept. 17	Sept. 24

Brush can be placed in paper yard waste bags for pick-up with regular refuse. Either bags with the City logo or generic bags can be used. Generic bags require one refuse sticker on each bag.

Brush (branches at least 3 ft. in length and less than 12" in diameter) must be placed on the parkway, cut ends facing the street before 7 a.m.

Do not tie bundles of brush with rope or wire. Brush must not be piled higher than 4 feet and never piled in the street.
