

Annual City Update Luncheon Delivers Latest News to Chamber of Commerce Members

Mayor Don DeWitte, First Ward Alderman Dan Stellato and city staff offered an updated look at current and pending projects and fielded questions at the City Update Luncheon hosted by the Chamber's Legislative Committee Oct. 16 at the Royal Fox Country Club.

Finances. Mayor DeWitte delivered good news about the city's finances. Despite dismal economic conditions over the last few years, responsible financial management has kept the city's tax levy flat this year. In addition, St. Charles earned an Aa1 rating from Moody's Investors Service as part of the city's bond issue for construction of the Red Gate Bridge and the replacement of trees infested by the Emerald Ash Borer.

City Council. Alderman Stellato briefed attendees on several issues that the City Council is expected to address in the coming months, including Lexington Club, Corporate Reserve, and rental licensing & property maintenance codes. He also discussed the municipal election in April 2013, where the offices of Mayor, Clerk, Treasurer, and five aldermanic seats will be filled.

Charlestowne Mall. Chris Aiston, Economic Development Director, offered insight into the benefits

of establishing the Charlestowne Mall/East Gateway area as a business TIF district that would stretch from Hunt Club Dr. to the city's eastern boundary. He also outlined recommendations for Charlestowne Mall from a recent feasibility study that proposed replacing mall ownership, developing new branding and making physical changes to the mall building.



Comprehensive Plan. Rita Tungare, Director of Community Development, offered updates on the Comprehensive Plan and the status of the Lexington Club, Corporate Reserve, and Regency Estates developments. Also, attendees learned more about the new Advanced Auto Parts store coming to the former Baker's Square site.

Infrastructure. Mark Koenen, Public Works Director, detailed the investments the city has made to improve

infrastructure. He discussed the completion of the Red Gate Bridge construction, which is set to open to vehicle traffic Dec. 15; work on Main Street, including intersection improvements at Oak St., pedestrian signal improvements between 7th St. and 7th Ave, and coordination with IDOT on the Main St./Rt. 64 project.

Rt. 64 Update

According to the Illinois Department of Transportation, Rt. 64/Main St. will open to four-lane traffic by mid-November, as previously scheduled, while major construction winds down for the year. Recycle Old Electronics at the City's Drop-Off Site

Supports State Landfill Ban of Home Electronics

Be sure to bring your old electronics to the city's Public Works facility, 1405 S. 7th Ave., Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for recycling. (No drop off on holidays).

This service offers residents a way to properly dispose of home electronics, which were banned from landfills in Illinois as of Jan. 1, 2012.

Computers, televisions, DVD players, printers and power tools are some examples of what can be recycled. A complete list of acceptable items is available on the city website www.stcharlesil.gov, on the Recycling and Waste page. Items not accepted include: white goods (large appliances) extra-large wood speakers, loose batteries, household hazardous waste.

There will be signs at the public works facility directing residents to the drop-off container. Items should be put in the boxes provided. Large televisions should be placed on the floor to the rear of the container. Please note there is no unloading assistance available at the facility.



Final Brush Pick Up for the Year

East Side **West Side**
Nov. 19 **Nov. 26**

Please place your brush along the street in front of your home. Brush (branches at least 3 ft. in length and less than 12" in diameter) must be placed on the parkway, cut ends facing the street before 7 a.m. The City also asks that residents place brush as close to collection day as possible to minimize damage to grass and maintain the attractiveness of our neighborhoods.

Do not tie bundles of brush with rope or wire. Brush must not be stacked higher than 4 ft. and never piled in the street.

Brush also can be placed in paper yard waste bags for pick-up with regular refuse. Either bags with the City logo or generic bags can be used. Generic bags require one refuse sticker per bag.

It's getting darker sooner, leaving all of us to rely on streetlights a little more. The St. Charles Electric Utility proactively maintains the city's streetlights. However, we also rely on residents to notify us when streetlights are out, flickering, or have other maintenance issues. If you notice a streetlight (not traffic signal) is out or malfunctioning, please contact us at 630-377-4407 or submit a customer service request on the city website www.stcharlesil.gov. Simply click on the Service Requests link under the "Popular" tab on the home page. On the right of the page is the "Support Topics" menu. Click on the last topic link, "Street/Sidewalk Maintenance and Reconstruction" and you will see a list of service request options. Click "Streetlights - damaged or broken" and create a service request. Please include your name and phone number so we may contact you if additional information is needed.

Leaf Collection Information & Tips

With the onset of Autumn comes falling leaves, which usually means plenty of raking. The City of St. Charles will provide fall leaf pick up according to the above schedule, beginning Oct. 25. An area map is provided on the next page.

Check your utility bill or call Utility Billing at 630-377-4426 if you have a question about your eligibility for leaf collection.

Please remember to pile raked leaves on the right-of-way or curb area in front of your home only. Do not rake, blow, or pile the leaves into the streets. Not only is this in violation of city ordinance, but piles of leaves in the street can clog storm sewer drains, create localized flooding, and make the roads slippery and dangerous for vehicles, bikes, and pedestrians.

Leaf collection regulations will be enforced. Residents in violation will be required to remove the leaves from the street within 24 hours and may be subject to fines of up to \$500.00 per day.

- Inclement weather or a large volume of leaves could alter the leaf pickup schedule.
- Leaf piles with vehicles parked in front of them will not be picked up.
- Leaves must be on the parkway by 6:30 a.m. on your designated collection day.
- Rake leaves in a row parallel to the street at least one foot back from the curb and off the sidewalk.
- Leaf piles will not kill grass, although they may cause it to discolor.
- Avoid raking foreign materials into leaf piles. This could damage equipment or cause injury to personnel collecting the leaves.
- As an alternative to pickup, leaves also may be put into yard waste bags for disposal.
- Yard waste bag pickup by Veolia ends the week of Nov. 26 on your regular refuse day.

Did you know fallen leaves are a great free resource? They contain nutrients such as phosphorous, potassium and nitrogen which break down and replenish the soil, acting like natural fertilizer. So consider mulching your leaves instead of collecting them for pickup.



Red Gate Bridge Opens to Vehicle Traffic Dec. 15

Ribbon Cutting is Planned

The two-lane car deck of the new Red Gate Bridge is set to open to vehicle traffic Dec. 15. The city will mark the occasion with a brief ribbon cutting ceremony on the bridge.



Construction on the pedestrian and bicycle pathway that will connect to existing trails on either side of the river is scheduled open in the spring of 2013.

The new Red Gate Bridge at Rt. 31 and Red Gate Road will provide St. Charles with its northernmost Fox River crossing. The city broke ground for the bridge in August 2011.
