Executive Summary (if not budgeted, please explain):

Over the last few years, the State of Illinois, along with other states, have entered into various agreements with companies to settle litigation regarding the harmful effects of opioid related products. These settlement agreements, once entered into by the State, allow certain units of local governments to participate in these agreements and receive a portion of the settlement funds. As is required and as may occur, staff have been bringing these settlement agreements for routine approval to the City Council, as it has been determined to be in the best interest of the City.

To-date, some of the companies that have entered into settlement agreements include Kroger, Walgreens, CVS, Eva, Allergan, Jansen Pharmaceuticals, Walmart and others. These settlement payments typically are a few thousand dollars over several installments. These funds are encouraged to be used to assist with opioid remediation efforts. To date, the City has collected \$172,053.

The City is in receipt of new national opioid settlement agreements with various entities including Alvogen, Amneal, Apotex, Hikma, Indivior, Mylan, Sun and Zydus, as well as a separate settlement agreement with Purdue and Sacklers. In order to ensure that the deadlines to opt-in and to participate in these agreements are met, the City Attorney recommends that authorization be given to the City Administrator to enter into these new agreements, and also have the authority to enter into new settlement agreements if they arise in the future.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of St. Charles, Kane and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

- Section 1. The facts and statements contained in the preamble clauses to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.
- Section 2. The corporate authorities of the City hereby elect to opt-in to the Settlement Agreements as they arise from time-to-time.
- Section 3. The corporate authorities of the City hereby authorize the City Administrator, or their designee, to execute those Settlement Agreements and execute any agreements, memoranda or other documents or other action necessary to allow the City to opt-in to those Agreements.
- Section 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption, as provided by law.
