St. Charles Police, Fire departments join forces for annual Polar Plunge fundraiser March 9 Ferson Creek Park event to benefit Special Olympics Illinois

ST. CHARLES, III. (Feb. 3, 2025) – The St. Charles Police and Fire departments' annual <u>Polar Plunge</u> returns to Ferson Creek Park on March 9, 2025. During the event, brave participants will take a chilly dip into icy waters to raise funds for Special Olympics Illinois programs and events.

The event kicks off at 10 a.m., when members of the St. Charles Police and Fire Departments, along with their families and friends, will plunge into the Fox River at Ferson Creek Park, located off Route 31, east of Wildrose Springs Drive in St. Charles.

All proceeds from the event will directly benefit Special Olympics Illinois, supporting year-round sports training and athletic competition for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Last year, the Polar Plunge raised \$17,415.69, contributing significantly to the total \$28,168.01 raised for 2024 (as of November).

St. Charles Police Detective Jennifer Larsen, Officer Steve Mattas, Firefighter Paramedic Steve Siwy, and Administrative Assistant Sara Cass are among the dedicated organizers working to make the event a success.

"We are incredibly grateful to the St. Charles community for its continued support of Special Olympics Illinois," said Larsen, who also serves as the team liaison to the nonprofit. "This is a fun event that promotes inclusion and raises awareness, while playing a vital role in supporting more than 20,000 adult and youth athletes in Illinois."

The fundraising event is open to the public. Community members are welcome to show their support by cheering on participants during the event. All attendees are strongly encouraged to carpool to Ferson Creek Park as parking will be limited.
