ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The open wide eaves and very heavy looking fascia dominate the façade along with the wrap around porch. All of the windows appear to be original and have a 6:6 muntin pattern. The ground floor is low relative to the surrounding grade.

ALTERATIONS: The porch features some interesting details, but doesn't match the design of the house. It appears that the porch was a later addition.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The small scale of this 1 ½ story house and the fact that it set low to the ground is charming. The corners of the front gable are cut back and the top of the gable features fish scale shingles. All of the window heads have cove moldings. There is spindle work detailing at the front porch as well as a turned column.

ALTERATIONS: An addition to the rear has a shed roof. The siding matches the original but the windows are missing the original detailing.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The broad eaves of the hipped roof emphasize the horizontal axis. The foundation, which is exposed and stops at the first floor line provides a visual base for the house and further emphasizes the horizontal. Wooden ornamental brackets support a small canopy over the front door. The window muntin pattern is a 3 over 1. Almost all of the windows are either paired or banded together which is another Prairie Style device.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: Several design features of this house emphasize the horizontal axis. The foundation at the base of the house, the banded windows, wide roof eaves, and the accent band at the head of the first floor windows. This would suggest a Prairie Style. The flat roofed entry canopy is unusual for this style as are the classical round columns.

ALTERATIONS: The oak front door with leaded glass appears to be recently installed. The entry canopy was probably remodeled at some time.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: Paired ornamental brackets that spring from a relatively deep frieze board support the eaves. The wrap around porch hides a lot of the original house.

ALTERATIONS: The porch and the flat roofed addition to the rear of the house are unsympathetic to the historic styling of the original house. The side entrance has a wooden stair and railing that have no ornamental detailing and a small aluminum canopy.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: All of the original window openings feature various wonderful wood detailing. There are several Eastlake window heads and window surrounds. The entrance is covered with a small canopy that is supported by a pair of very large wooden brackets. A one story bay window located on the south elevation also features Eastlake influenced wood moldings.

ALTERATIONS: The additions to the rear utilized similar materials to the original but they have several different roof types that do not match. There is a gable portion, a shed, and a flat roof.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: This is a small Dutch Colonial design that features a variety of roof types. The main roof is the side gambrel. There is a shed roof dormer centered over the front entrance. The entrance is covered with a stylized gable supported by wooden Doric columns. There is a one - story room on the south side that has a hipped roof. Some of the windows are paired which is a typical design device seen in the colonial revival styles.

ALTERATIONS: The soffits, rake moldings and gutters are aluminum.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: This house features a variety of roof types. The front gable has a large Palladian window flanked by an oval window on each side that is on axis with the entry and its gabled canopy. Clustered columns that are raised to porch rail height by nicely detailed wood plinth blocks support the wrap around porch roof. All of the gabled ends of the roof s and dormers feature free classic detailing. The front two corners of the plan are articulated with multi-story bays that are topped by facetted hip type roofs and an accompanying gabled roof dormer.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: This is a small 1½ story house possessing a charming street scale. The cut away at the front gable is capped with a constructed cove as opposed to the more common coved trim. This front gable has Eastlake detailing at the top. The entrance is covered with small porch that features a small gable with fish scale shingles that is not centered over the door. The Doric columns appear to be FRP and not original.

ALTERATIONS: There is an addition to the rear that has a simple gabled roof and is constructed from similar materials. This addition is somewhat sympathetic with the original house. This is currently a commercial occupancy.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The gable ends are very prominent features of the façade. These are emphasized by the houses location on a corner lot of a very busy intersection. The west gable has cut away corners and an elaborate decorative truss at the peak. The cut away soffits have decorative pendant detailing along the edge of the overhang. The south gable has a one-story bay window that is sided with diagonal clapboards. Another decorative truss is located at the peak of the gable. A turned column supports the entry porch hipped roof. There doesn't appear to be a main entrance. Two doors are located off the porch and another entry is located on the south side off the parking area. There is another entry for a second floor tenant on the north side that is accessed via an exterior stairway. The stair is detailed sympathetically with the original house except for the

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The facades are divided vertically into three main levels through the use of plain wood shingles at the base, clapboard at the middle coinciding with the windows of the first floor, and clapboard at the second floor. The foundation does not play a major part in the exterior appearance. There is a shed dormer on both the north and south sides of the roof. There is no covering or additional detailing marking the entrance.

ALTERATIONS: There are relatively few alterations to the original house. The front door is aluminum and there are a few aluminum replacement windows distributed around the house.

ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: An unusually textured concrete block impressed with crushed colored glass forms the skin of this house. The glass adds a rich, soft earthy color. The base of the house is also a textured concrete block that has a soft buff color and is separated from the soft earthy red color with a string-course of white block. Monolithic concrete lintels and sills are used throughout the house. Each side elevation of the roof has a gabled dormer.

ALTERATIONS: A porch was a later addition to the rear of the house. It is sided in clapboard and has a concrete foundation. The soffits are aluminum. The original front porch has been screened in.



ALTERATIONS: There was some detail added to the columns when the porch was closed in. Simple decorative moldings were placed at the tops to give the impression of capitals. The center two columns were sheathed in wood and plain moldings added at the corners. This was most probably done in order to give more emphasis to the entrance. The front door is relatively new and non compatible with the original design as is the detailing on the columns. The brick columns and railing have been painted to match the textured CMU of the main part of the house. The 3:1 window muntin pattern used on the porch infill is attractive, but doesn't match the original windows.
