**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The eaves of the roof are narrow and ungracious for the scale of the roof and home. A 2- story bay on the south side articulates the mass of the walls and the roofline. The hipped roof dormer centered on the front of the of the house is another distinguishing feature.

**ALTERATIONS:** The front porch has been closed in. The windows of the porch do not currently match the rest of the house as the proportions of the openings do not match nor do the muntin patterns. The porch foundation is skirted with a wooden lattice while the deck is accessed by a CIP concrete stoop and a wrought iron railing.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The broad eaves and the horizontal trim dividing the ground floor and the second floor are characteristic of the style. Stucco covers the entire house while broad clapboards cover the porch. Columns that start at grade level support the hipped roof of the porch. The bottoms of the porch edge beams are subtly sloped creating an arched effect. The front stoop was rebuilt.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** It appears that the front porch was remodeled at some time, as the detailing does not match the side porch. The side porch still retains the original spindle work and turned columns while a single square column supports the front porch and the rail is comprised of square balusters. The front stairs are constructed of wood and has a wrought iron handrail.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The spindle-work detailing on the porch is the most striking feature of the house. The turned columns that support the porch roof appear to be thin in proportion to their function. The porch end is gracefully curved as it returns to the main mass of the house. The front gable has cutaway corners on the ground floor somewhat concealed by the roof of the porch. There is also a leaded glass transom on the ground floor bay on the porch. The eaves re open. The stone foundation is an important feature contributing to the historic character of the facades.

**ALTERATIONS:** A lot of the historic details were lost when the house was re-sided with aluminum. The imbrication that would have been located in the gable ends was concealed/removed. The eaves are covered with aluminum. A two story open deck was added to the rear of the house that features no Queen Anne detailing and is therefore not compatible. The spindle work detailing appears to have been added as the proportions don't seem appropriate.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** There is a noticeable absence of imbrication in the gable ends – which could mean that the house was re-sided. The heads of the window trim appear to have been removed as brackets that would have supported them remain. Original spindle-work details remain on a small entry porch asymmetrically placed on the front elevation. Fish-scale shingles were used on the small roof covering the ground floor window of the front gable end. This window project slightly and is supported by two wooden brackets. The stone foundation contributes to the historic character of the house. The eaves are open and are sheathed in wood.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** Features a large 2 story gabled portico supported by stylized Greek Doric columns. There is a 2<sup>nd</sup> story balcony supported by the portico columns. The portico is designed in the Greek temple form. The house is sited on a hill, also typical of Greek temple planning. The window surrounds exhibit typically simple Greek detailing. The house is sided with narrow wood clapboards with a 5" exposure.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This is currently a multi-family residence with an address of 500 W. Indiana on the side entrance. The 1 ½ story portico over the 5<sup>th</sup> Street entrance is the dominant architectural feature. Here large disproportionate square columns support a gabled roof. The gable end is cut out in an almost Post Modern manner expressing no particular stylistic reference. An elaborated surround adds emphasis and interest to what appears to be the main entry. The overall impression is Colonial revival but a lack of appropriate details precludes classification as such.

**ALTERATIONS:** The original house was a modest structure that is now completely hidden by numerous additions and modifications.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This house possessed a diminutive scale adding to its charming street presence. The porch was covered with the continuation of the main roof tucked in beneath the eave of the front gable. The entrance was not emphasized as it was tucked into the corner of the porch. The doorway did not have special trim. The two windows placed in the front gable had an extra crown molding that the other windows did not have.

**ALTERATIONS:** The original house was totally transformed from what is pictured here. A substantial addition has been made to the north and west sides of the original structure. The original house has been completely remodeled.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** Steeply pitched cross gabled roofs where the smaller front gable is even more steeply pitched that the other roofs. This smaller front gable and the side gable are clipped. Decorated barge boards run along the rakes of the gables. All of the walls extend into the gable thereby exaggerating the height of the façade which is typical of the style. The window surrounds are detailed with an elaborate head trim. The porch supports are square columns that feature flattened arches.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** An elevated site contributes to the impression of a large-scale street presence. The 12:12 roof slope adds vertical emphasis. Fish-scale shingles decorate the front gable end of the façade flowing in a fluid manner over the window heads to provide some protection from the elements. The flare at the third story window is a gentle curve. The heads of the second story windows of the front elevation are covered with a small roof that is the continuation of the fish-scale shingles sloping gently out from the main plane of the gable end. A relatively broad frieze board trim was used along the rake of the front gable.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The front gable is the dominant architectural element of the façade. A small-hipped roof supported by ornate wooden brackets tops a one-story bay window on the ground floor of the front gable. Wooden brackets support the overhang and patterned vergeboards decorate the peak of the front gable. Carved wooden brackets support a small-hipped roof over the entrance located off center to the left of the front gable. Modest pediment forms are typically used over the window heads. The front stoop is constructed with native stone and appears to be original construction.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The front door is off centered and is placed in its own gabled entry vestibule. A stucco/half timber gable form is a prominent feature of the street elevation. It was added at the time of a substantial remodeling of the house that included the entry vestibule and the rear addition.

**ALTERATIONS:** A large one-story addition was made to the rear of the house. It features a hipped roof and stucco/half timber wall finishes. The addition has no relationship with the original style.



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
