

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The fish scale shingles used on the front gable and the roof dormers are the featured detail of the house. This imbrication may have been added as it is used in an unusual manner. There is a small pediment placed over the front entry that serves a functional role in diverting water as well as a decorative role.

**ALTERATIONS:** This house has been aluminized. The original siding has been replaced and aluminum windows and trim has replaced the original wood. There is a one story addition featuring a hipped roof to the rear of the house that has a concrete foundation.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This roof is relatively steep – approximately 12:12. The front gable features a pair of windows. The south elevation of the roof has a shed dormer that may have been added later.

**ALTERATIONS:** The front porch was closed in to make a 3 or 4 season room. This house has been aluminized. The siding, windows, front door and soffits have been changed. There is a small porch that was added to the rear of the house.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This is a uniquely styled bungalow home that displays quirky but attractive details not commonly seen in the bungalow style.

**ALTERATIONS:** The front porch was closed in with a window pattern with transoms that does not match the original. Large gables have been added to both the north and south elevations. These exhibit the same pointed arch cut away that is in the front gable. The front gable appears to have been modified from the original. All of the gables have fish scale wood shingles.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This 1 ½ story home has charming cottage scale that is accentuated with very steeply pitched roofs. A brick chimney that soars high next to the front entry features a couple of gabled details that add a little whimsy to the house. The arched top transom above the front door works with the chimney adding to the playfulness of the cottage style.

**ALTERATIONS:** A single story addition was made to the rear of the house that is somewhat in keeping with the original with the notable exception of a shallower roof pitch.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The windows do not appear to be organized on the front façade. The small enclosed entry has a hipped roof and is visually supported by two slender fluted pilasters. A stepped frieze detail that encircles the house at the second floor is also used at the eave of the front porch. The large picture window appears out of place on the front façade. This window has removable wooden storms. The first floor is sheathed with wide horizontal boards and the second floor is sheathed in vertical board and batten.

**ALTERATIONS:** A small garage was added haphazardly to the southwest corner of the house. While it is constructed with the same details as the original house.....it appears out of place and scale.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story cottage features a large brick chimney placed alongside the main entry in the front gable. The entry door has an arched top transom that is covered with an arched canopy that is supported by wood brackets. These front door elements reside in their own small gabled peak. The main front gable has a hipped peak. A couple pair of windows seen on the front elevation do not occur elsewhere on the house.

ALTERATIONS: All of the aluminum materials appear to have been added.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The front gable, which features Lannon stone, is the dominant element of the front elevation. A frieze tops the stone wall as the material changes to the wood siding in the upper wall. There is a round attic louver in the gable end that relates to a round spoked window on the north elevation. The front entry is flanked with two fluted pilasters. A subtly curved bow window is located adjacent to the entry.

ALTERATIONS: A flat roofed garage appears to have been added to the north side of the house.







**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** A large, somewhat out of scale, hipped dormer and a wrap-around porch are the dominant elements of the front façade. The south façade features the previously mentioned porch and a two-story bay projection.

**ALTERATIONS:** All of the original detailing has been stripped away or covered. The porch supports are wrought iron as are the railing and balusters.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** A second empire turret with a third story balcony towers over the front porch and entry. The front gable next to it is a two story bay plan projection that features fish scale shingles in the pediment. A similarly detailed bay element is located on the north side of the house. Paired classic columns that rest on stone piers at the porch rail elevation support the front porch roof. This flat roof skirted with fish scale wood shingles continues over the driveway to create a porte cochere that is also supported by round classic columns resting on battered stone piers. A small bay window supported by wood brackets can be seen on the front under the porch roof.



ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES: The original broad boxed eaves have been retained but have been covered in aluminum.

**ALTERATIONS:** The front of the house has been significantly altered. The porch has been closed in to create a 4-season room and a large window that has no precedent in the original design has been installed. No evidence of the original columns or details remain visible from the street. There is a chimney that was added to the south side of the house. The entire house has been resided in aluminum and all of the original detailing removed or concealed. Louvers have replaced the original widows in the front roof dormer.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The gambrel roof form is articulated by a trim course placed at the change in roof pitch and runs into the gambrel end and becoming discontinuous. The ends of this trim course are visually ties by another trim course that would have been a frieze band. Wood shingles cover the gambrel end over the front porch. A fan window is located over three windows that are centered in the front gambrel end. Round classic Doric columns resting on stone piers support the second floor overhang that covers the front entry. The front door and first floor windows are not symmetrically positioned on the façade. The front door appears to be the original wooden door while the wrought iron rail that leads to it does not. The transoms of the front

#### **ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:**

windows feature diagonal muntins and leaded glass. Similar diagonal muntins are placed in the windows of the bay projection located over the side entrance on the north elevation.

**ALTERATIONS:** Some of the original removable storm sashes have been removed and replaced with aluminum inserts and the wrought iron railing and concrete stoop were changes from the original.

**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** The large side gabled roof, the open eaves, and open porch are the surviving distinctive architectural elements linking this house to its former style.

**ALTERATIONS:** The current ½ timber siding scheme completely conceals the original materials and details. A poorly constructed shed dormer runs the entire width of the front part of the roof. Aluminum has replaced most of the original wood. Almost none of the original wood details can be seen although some clapboard can be seen in the side gable at the third floor. A shed dormer was also added to the rear of the house.


**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** Exposed rafter tails decorate the eaves of the roof. Wooden brackets also articulate the side gable overhangs. Decorative wooden trusses were used to add interest to the gable ends of the main roof as well as to the roof dormer. The widows located on the first floor have dressed limestone sills. Wood shingles were used above the second floor in all gabled ends.

ALTERATIONS: The front porch was closed in thereby losing the deep recess and shadow line of the original porch.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** This is an unusual house that attempts to relate to its corner site. The hipped roofed wall dormer defines the front access to the main part of the house that appears to be the side of the house. A porch that has been screened in conceals this access. The entrance to the porch is from the south side, which appears to be the front of the house. The south elevation features a two story gabled form with a broken pediment and a discontinuous frieze band. A single story bay window with a sloped roof is also located on this elevation. The eaves are boxed in with wooden strips. The windows have a 3:1 muntin pattern consistently around the house.



**ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES:** Exposed rafter tails, wooden brackets, and broad open eaves articulate the roofs edge. A shed dormer is centrally located on the front of the house. There is a one story bay window centered on the south elevation that is covered with a sloped roof. The house has recently been repainted and looks well maintained.

ALTERATIONS: The front porch has been screened in and has an aluminum door.
