Events



During the first quarter of 2023, St. Charles Police Department has been busy participating in a wide variety of events throughout the city, and outside of the city.

On January 30th, Officer Kramer and Charlie were invited to the Richmond/Davis literacy night. Officer Kramer was able to read a book to the kids about different types of service dogs and how they help kids with different disabilities. The book was titled "Our Service Dogs" and was donated to the school after reading.

The St. Charles Police Department worked with Compass Academy to hold a First Responders Course for high school

students. Officers taught classes on Crime Scene Processing, Accident

Reconstruction, Crime Prevention, Criminal Investigations and DUI. The course culminated with a full scenario where the students had to respond to and investigate a crime and conduct the initial investigation. In the scenario, students performed many roles which included dispatchers, medics, patrol officers, detectives and crime scene technicians while Compass Academy staff performed as role players. The class was well received by students and staff.



Officer Kramer and Detective Rentschler went to the College of DuPage's Military-



Connected Career and Internship Fair. This was an event hosted by COD for veterans and their families to come out and meet local employers. The employers were not just law enforcement agencies. The city of St. Charles had a representative from HR, and the Fire Department as well. This was a great way for veterans to get to know about the Police Department, Fire Department and the city.

The St. Charles Police Department, along with the Fire Department and other city staff participated in the Polar Plunge. This was held outside of the old Police Department in the beginning of March. Members who participated plunged into cold water to raise money for the Special Olympics. The Police, Fire, and Friends Team was able to raise \$18,330. Other participants were from Batavia Police Department, the Kane County State's Attorney's Office, and two Special Olympic Athletes.

On Saturday, March 11th, the city held its annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. There were over eighty floats and lots of participants who walked in it. It was great to see so many residents out despite the weather being colder.

Other than Cop on a Rooftop, be sure to mark your calendars for a couple of other events that will be happening. Saturday, April 22nd, is the DEA drug takeback event. This is for St. Charles residents to come dispose of their prescription medications safely. No needles, inhalers, liquids, or aerosols can be taken. This event will be held from 10:00 AM to 2: 00 PM at the Northwestern Medical Office 2570 Foxfield Rd. in the East parking lot.

Saturday, May 6th the Police Department will be participating in a shred event with the Kane County Credit Union. This takes place at the old Police Department, 211 N. Riverside Ave. starting at 9:00 AM and go until 11:00 AM. The shred event is open to residents of St. Charles only.

Scam Awareness

The St. Charles Police Department has seen a recent uptick in online scams leading to fraud over the last couple of weeks. Many of these fraudulent incidents have occurred while the victim has been using the internet. Listed below is a friendly reminder on what to do and what not to do when using the internet.

- Never click on pop-ups or unknown links
- Do not provide banking information to anyone you do not know
- Do not provide any money to strangers online or over the phone
- If you are asked to make purchases, or send money for items such as gift cards, Bitcoin, etc. do not provide the money or make the purchases
- Reach out to your bank if you need confirmation for emails, links, or phones calls you may view as suspicious
- Use virus protection and malware on your devices
- Complete all online banking on a secure network. These will usually include a "https" at the beginning of the link
- Should access to your bank account be accessed by someone who is not authorized, immediately contact your bank and freeze all accounts
- Should you be come a victim of these scams, contact your local police department as soon as possible


Charlie's Corner

Charlie and the St. Charles Police Department hope the citizens and their pets are able to get outside and enjoy the nice weather soon!




Police Report Comparisons

The first quarter reports were completed between January 1, 2023—March 31, 2023 and the fourth quarter reports were completed between October 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022. The crimes listed below are some of the more common crimes we see here in the city of St. Charles. Remember, if you see something suspicious, call 911.
