


Summer is going by quickly and the school year will start back up on August 14th. The St. Charles Police Department would like to remind everyone that the school zone speed limits will be back in effect. This means when children are present all vehicles must slow their speeds down to **20 MPH**.

Not only are the speed limits important to watch for, but school buses as well. Remember, when the stop arm is out all driver's must stop. Keep in mind that violators are being reported to the traffic safety officer. Should a driver get convicted of this violation, there is

a mandatory three month suspension of the driver's license.

The St. Charles Police Department partnered with Northwestern Medicine for the DEA Drug Take Back event on Saturday, April 22nd. The event ended a little early due to inclement weather. Scam Awareness



Today, many people get calls from numbers they do not recognize. The people who are doing these calls have many different motives. They could be trying to get money, personal information, or even information on your family members. Even if the phone number appears to be from the area, a scammer could be calling from another country. There's many different ways to get fake phone numbers to

match the area codes of where the scammer may be calling. The "do not call" registry is one good way to help protect yourself from phone scams. You can register on the FTC.gov website and report unwanted calls on the website as well.

Don't forget that scams are not only through a phone call, but can come through as a text message. Treat this no differently than an online scam. Do not click on any links sent to you, do not provide any personal information, and be sure to delete the text. Also, look at the time the text message was sent. Some of the more recent text message scams have been sent around two or three o'clock in the morning.

other animals and gets along with them great!



The first quarter reports were completed between January 1, 2023 and March 31, 2023. The crimes listed below are some of the more common crimes we see here in the city of St. Charles. Remember, if you see something suspicious, call 911.
