fire safety hazard for yourself and those around you. It's best to just get some bags and place them on garbage day.

Hopefully fall will last awhile, but we never know with the unpredictable Illinois weather. Once it changes to cold, rain, sleet, and snow keep in mind best driving habits listed below.

Leave early so you're not rushing.

Keeping distance between cars.

Drive slowly.

Keep your gas tank full at least half full.

Keep extra coats or blankets in your car.

Be patient with others on the road.

Scam Awareness



Before we know it, the holidays will be here. During this time of year there may be a rise in scams. Be sure to protect yourself and others from scams that may arise over the next few months. Read the tips below to prevent yourself from becoming a victim.

- Be careful of deals that seem "too good to be true". Emails may be sent out to entice people into deals that appear to be really good.
- Check into gift vouchers that are offered online, be sure to verify they
 are coming from a legitimate company.
- Never click on suspicious links or pop-up ads.
- When making purchases online, check to see if the link starts with "HTTPS". This means that the website you are purchasing form is using a secure platform. If it starts with "HTTP", it is best to not provide personal information on that website.
- If you are purchasing from a website for the first time, research and look at the reviews of the company.
- Be leery of purchasing from people on social media. Do research to ensure the profile is legitimate if you decide to purchase from someone.
- Always trust your gut feeling. If something doesn't see right, or add up, do not go through with it.
- If you believe you have been a victim of a scam call the police and file a report.

Make sure to have fun, Charlie wants to see all the kids out and about having fun being as safe as possible!




Police Report Comparisons

The second quarter reports were completed between April 1, 2023 and June 30, 2023. The crimes listed below are some of the more common crimes we see here in the city of St. Charles. Remember, if you see something suspicious, call 911.
