This is a great opportunity for the citizens of St. Charles to learn about police work. The classes are set up to help educate citizens on what specifically the St. Charles Police Department has to offer, what the department deals with daily, and much more.



During the summer, the Youth Police Academy will once again be offered. The Youth Police Academy is a



week long academy where the kids ranging from 13-17 years old get to experience a wide range of different aspects of law enforcement. The

academy is not only law enforcement specific, the kids get to go to the Fire Department to become CPR certified, visit the court house and experience a mock trial, as well. Be sure to look out for those dates as they will be coming out in the next couple of months.

Every year, the St. Charles Police Department participates in the DEA "drug take back" day. Citizens of St. Charles are able to bring their prescription pills to be dropped off and disposed of safely. Aerosols and liquids will not be accepted. Prescription pet medication will be accepted as well as long as it is in pill form. This has been a very successful event for the Police Department and the DEA. This year the event will be held on Saturday, April 29th.

City Events




This fall, there were several events that the St. Charles Police Department was happy to participate in.

Scam Awareness



Now that winter is here, don't forget scammers are still out there!

The city of St. Charles has a no soliciting ordinance, which does not always stop people from coming around to homes. With the snowy and cold weather, some common scams we see, are furnace repair, plowing / shoveling, and home repair to help prevent cold and snow from getting into the house.

Keep in mind it is important to always ask for proper identification, proof of insurance or licensing, and a copy of a contract. Try to use companies known to the area, and always get a copy of the contract or receipt for payment. Do not be afraid to turn away people going door-to-door offering services. If need be, call the St. Charles Police Department to report potential scammers in the area.

If you are looking to have work done on your home, be sure to research companies to ensure there are not any scam alerts.

Should you become a victim of a scam, report the incident to the St. Charles Police Department as soon as possible.

Charlie's Corner

As the weather gets colder, Charlie wants to remind everyone to bring their pets inside. It is illegal to leave a companion animal outside in extreme temperatures that could result in injury or death to them. To learn more about this law check out 510 ILCS 70/3.01.

The city of St. Charles has its own local ordinance for animal cruelty as well. The city ordinance is similar to the Illinois state law in regards to the protection of animal welfare. To learn more about the city's ordinance on animal cruelty, research the ordinance 6.12.110.



Charlie encourages anyone who may see an animal outside in extreme conditions and showing signs of distress to call 911.

Remember, each breed of dog and cat are different so the amount of time for an animal to feel distress from extreme cold varies. Charlie loves all animals and does not want to see any animals suffering from extreme weather conditions.



The third quarter reports were completed between July 1, 2022—September 30, 2022 and the fourth quarter reports were completed between October 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022. The crimes listed below are some of the more common crimes we see here in the city of St. Charles. Remember, if you see something suspicious, call 911.
