- I. Identification of community concerns for youth
 - A. discussions with our community partners

 - C. discussions with our student consultants and other student groups
 - D. analysis of data provided by above groups

- II. Prioritize community concerns for youth
 - A. which issue(s) impacts the youth of St. Charles in terms of numbers
 - B. which issue(s) impact the youth of St. Charles in terms of immediate safety/health
 - C. which issues(s) does the community view as most pressing

- III. Identify the underlying factors creating/adding to these issues
 - A. makes something large and abstract more concrete and manageable
 - B. proactive instead of reactive
 - C. which underlying factors overlap (“killing two birds with one stone” concept)

- III. Target current community solutions and/or gaps in service
 - A. what programs currently exist that could address these factors
 - B. what are these programs needing to more effectively address the issue
 - C. how can we connect more citizens with that program
 - D. what community programs can we connect with each other

- IV. Propose development of new programs and services
 - A. solicit ideas from our community partners
 - B. solicit ideas from our community youth and other outside agencies (targeted grants)
 - C. solicit ideas from our Youth Commission Members

- V. Implement
 - A. obtain any needed approval from city council
 - B. approve funding
