1. Two upcoming workshops: on November 3rd, there will be a middle school transition program to replace CORE for 6th grade boys and girls. On January 26th, there will be a COMPASS program that utilizes the Chick Chat curriculum to help girls in fourth and fifth grades to navigate adolescence.
