- I. Meeting called to order @ 6:00 p.m.
- II. Secretary’s Report
 - A. Approval of the minutes from the October 2019 meeting. Motion to approve; carried.
- III. Treasurer’s Report – Jayme Muenz
 - A. Balance is \$10,990. Funded \$300 In October for the St. Charles North Friends of Music.

 - A. Cheryl spoke with a representative from the Salvation Army to review details on the funding request they submitted that the Youth Commission denied.

 - A. Liaison Reports
 - i. D303 – absent
 - ii. Park District – Jennifer Bruggeman
 - a. The Park District will be submitting a funding request soon.
 - b. More new members are attending the Teen Center each month. 92 new kids visited in October.
 - c. The St. Charles Underground/Teen Center is enjoying the partnership with the library and will be hosting an anime club plus many other new and fun activities.
 - d. The Park District hosted a special event – pumpkin smashing / bowling which raised over \$200 for the Teen Center.
 - e. Employees are getting ready for no school days over holiday break.
 - f. There will be a new after school program at Wasco School beginning in January.

- g. The Park District currently runs eight after school programs and this year added before school care on the west side of town. These programs fill a need and provide the community with an affordable childcare option. In this regard, the partnership with D303 has been very successful.

iii. Police Department – absent

- a. Offense listing was submitted for the group to review in Officer Burden's absence.

iv. Library Programs – Nick Chaney

- a. Upstairs where the Young Adult collection is, there is currently a book display, but they are going to be using only half and then creating a new take home collection for kids to bring books home for free. This will include nonfiction books about drugs, alcohol, LGBTQ, and books on other topics younger individuals might not be comfortable checking out with their library cards.

- i. Commissioner Wiese met with Lisa Garhan. They will be adding new text to the Youth Commission webpage and also including links to include: Student Consultant applications, Grant Funding requests, and Youth Impact Award nomination forms.
