- II. Secretary's Report
  - A. Approval of the minutes from the November 2019 meeting. Motion to approve; carried.
- III. Treasurer's Report – Jayme Muenz
  - A. Balance is \$9,736.27.

- VI. Reports
  - A. Liaison Reports
    - i. D303 – absent; Patti Palagi sent a report in her absence
      - a. The Big Hearts of Fox Valley is hosting a gift drive with wrapping event to take place December 10<sup>th</sup>.
      - b. D303 has plans to use the cafeteria at Haines to build 2 classrooms to create an apartment like space for students to practice daily living space.
      - c. There is also a business program that will be going into Haines by August 2020.
      - d. Parent University events are on the website. In October, D303 brought Josh Ochs in for high school and middle school presentations.
      - e. Feb/March – There is a book study on *The Whole Brain Child* by Dr. Dan Siegel. Participants will pick up books on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>.
      - f. D303 is seeking community partners for HS student internships. Contact Dr. Byrne if interested.
      - g. Compiled socioemotional data will be presented in January.
    - ii. Park District – Jennifer Bruggeman
      - a. 107 different kids visited the teen center in November.

- b. The Teen Center is enjoying great programming and the new partnership with the library.
- c. Lots of new girls have been attending which sets a different tone for the group. Overall, it's a great bunch of kids.
- d. Exam cram is being held at the Teen Center.
- e. The Park District expects even more kids to drop in when the library is displaced.
- f. In the Haines building, the Park District will be utilizing the gym and former music rooms as early as February with plans to rent space to local sport leagues, offer a walking track, and lots of pickle ball court time.

iii. Police Department – Jim Burden

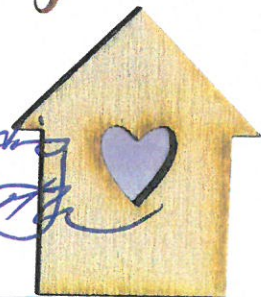

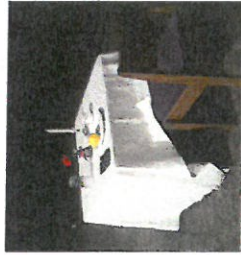
