Guitar of St. Charles Jank Award

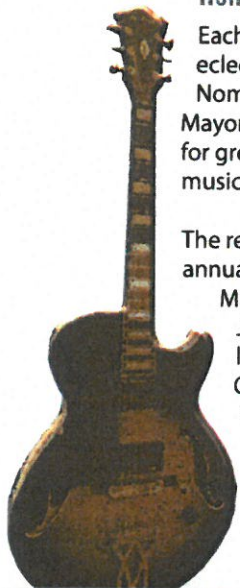
Established by Mayor Ray Rogina in partnership with The Jank Guitar Store, the Guitar of St. Charles Jank Award is a prestigious honor celebrating the artistic diversity and achievements of St. Charles' young people. Outstanding youth who contribute to the community's cultural landscape by broadening local tastes and bringing awareness of the global musical arts community to St. Charles will be eligible for the award.

Jank is an amalgamation of everything artistic and represents a generation that hasn't yet been spoken for but whose unprecedented access to the world has granted them a more diverse set of artistic influences than any previous generation. By unifying diverse genres Jank gives an essential sense of unity to today's young people.

Honorees

Each year the community will be invited to nominate talented young people with the most eclectic taste and ability to appreciate and express different genres - the Jank tradition. Nominees will be judged by a panel with representatives from the St. Charles Park District, the Mayor's Office and The Jank Guitar Store on their proficiency for performing and/or advocating for greater access to genre-diverse music.

The recipient will be honored in an annual ceremony hosted by the Mayor of St. Charles and The Jank Guitar Store at the location of the Statue of the Official Guitar of St. Charles. The recipient will receive an award and for a period of 1 year they will keep and document their use of the "St. Charles Youth Ambassador Guitar" provided by The Jank Guitar Store.



Cultural Ambassadorship

Throughout the year the award recipient will be the ambassador of musical diversity in the St. Charles community. At the end of the year they will participate in the selection panel for the following year's recipient, and in the ceremony hand down the "St. Charles Youth Ambassador Guitar" to the next recipient. This will build a legacy of artistic diversity and cultivate the community of local musical arts in St. Charles.

Youth Commission Members,

During the April meeting of the Youth Commission I advised that I would again be seeking monetary assistance with this year's youth police academy. At this time I would officially like to request funds to help facilitate this endeavor.

This will be the fourth consecutive year we have run this program. This year's academy will run from June 13-17.

The target audience is youth from 13-16 years old. CUSD 303 students who live within the city of St. Charles would be given preference, with CUSD 303 students outside the city limits used to fill in the class if necessary. The class will run from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. A daily schedule is in the works, but will include a tour of the police department, a briefing on what police patrol is like, what constitutes a crime, SWAT, mock crime scene, mock trial, juvenile law, bullying, illegal drugs and alcohol use, Internet/personal/traffic safety, a Taser overview and CPR/first aid certification.

The class will once again end with a graduation ceremony during which certificates of completion will be issued. The classes will be completed with volunteer instructors. However, there is a cost associated with the CPR certification. The fire department has advised the cost to certify will be \$25 each. We have decided to once again limit the class to 25 students.

I am requesting funds in the amount of \$725 for the following:

CPR and first aid certification – 25 certifications at \$25 each = \$625

Other assorted class materials = \$100

If the 25 student max is not reached, the difference from the CPR funding will be repaid. If the commission is not willing to front the full amount above, any amount that the commission feels is reasonable could be used to lower the CPR fee for the participant.

The class has been well received over the first three years, with participants asking if they could come back to participate, or even assist instructors. It is evident that this class is a great benefit to the youth, and in turn, the community of St. Charles. Any assistance you can provide would be greatly appreciated.
