I. Meeting called to order @ 6:00 p.m.

II. Secretary's Report

A. Approval of the minutes from the May 2019 meeting. Motion to approve; carried.

III. Treasurer's Report - Cliff Hime

- A. The Youth Commission started the new fiscal year (May 1, 2019) with \$15,000. To date, the following funding has been approved:
 - i. TriCity Family Services for \$1,380.00;
 - ii. St. Charles East High School Auto Club for \$830.00;
 - iii. St. Charles Police Youth Academy for \$1,500.

ii. Park District - Jennifer Bruggeman

a. Both pools are up and running;

b. Kids have been getting dropped off at the teen center; oftentimes they leave the facility in groups and then meet back up at the facility to get picked up;

c. One of the managers at Otter Cove was in a fatal car accident. With the assistance of Jules O'Neal from TriCity Family Services, Park District staff was able to provide resources for employees.

iii. Police Department - Officer Jim Burden

a. Discussion on the multiple juvenile violations for the month;

b. Juvenile arrest listing attached.

iv. Library Programs - Brandon Buckley

- a. Summer reading begins June 10th;
- b. All D303 students are welcome to participate in summer reading program. Residents outside of city limits cannot check out books but they can still participate in the program.
- c. Anyone from infants through 7th grade who reads 1,000 minutes or more are entered into a raffle where the grand prize is a Nintendo Switch.
- d. High School students have two levels: read 4 books and earn coupons for a t-shirt; read 8 books and earn more coupons for other incentives. Approximately 100 participants are expected to take part in this program.
- e. Library representatives visited the STC Underground last week to register kids for the summer reading program.
- f. The library will collaborate with Darby and Dan from the Park District Teen Center to run programs together in the fall. There will be a Japanese supermarket field trip opportunity, among others.
- g. Library staff is discussing the pros and cons of staying open during their upcoming expansion or to move to a temporary location.
- h. Both homes remaining on the library property have been demolished.
- i. Garden plots located off of Illinois Avenue on the library property were built and planted. Children worked with master gardeners to complete this task.

v. TriCity Family Services - Jules O'Neal

- a. The facility witnessed a flurry of activity at the end of the school year.
- b. The wilderness camp group leaves later in June.
- c. There is a golf outing on June 24th and more information about TriCity's Christmas in July can be found on their website.

B. Outreach Sub-Committee Report

i. The Outreach Subcommittee did not meet.

VII. Old Business

A. Impact Award - Daniel Kelly

- a. It was an honor for the Youth Commission to be able to recognize Katie Cantrell for all of her important contributions in our community.
- b. In the future, members of the Youth Commission would like to consider honoring more students each year. The possibility of offering a scholarship was also discussed.
- c. Youth Commission members will look into diversifying methods to identify a wider range of students who may be eligible to receive this award.
- d. Dan will head up this initiative again this year.
- B. Student Consultants: Commissioners Clavelli and Kristofer volunteered to look at ways our student consultants can be utilized this fall.
- C. Window Displays: Commissioner Weick will continue to work on securing window displays for the Youth Commission to spread their message in the community.

D. Treasurer Nomination: Commissioner Kristopher made a motion to nominate Jayme Muenz as the new Youth Commission Treasurer. Commissioner Saylors seconded; motion passed unanimously.

- B. Discuss overall Youth Commission Strategic Plan
 - i. Commissioners have welcomed many great presenters this year.
 - ii. Along with funding incoming requests, there is a desire to be more proactive and purposeful in assisting youth and sharing the Youth Commission message in the community.
 - iii. Reflections are as follows:
 - a. Many presenters highlighted the need for a parenting education component.
 - b. Across the board, kids are feeling a lot of stress and pressure and are not learning how to fail.
 - c. Mentoring is important, both kids and adults and kids with other kidsm due to the fact many children listen to other kids more than they listen to adults.
 - d. Childcare is a concern for Lazarus House.
 - e. Identify ways to boost confidence and tap into at risk kids who go under the radar.
 - f. Transportation issues need to be addressed.
 - g. Times of transition are hard (i.e. elementary to middle school, middle school to high school).
 - h. Consider digital component web and text-based support and resources are available.
 - i. Collaboration with community partners is important and beneficial.
 - j. Summer can be unpredictable when kids do not have a routine.
 - k. ACES are factors that put kids at high risk for behavioral and mental health concerns.
 - iv. To address these needs and concerns, commissioners would like to:
 - a. Create a network of volunteers.
 - b. Expand collaboration with community partners.
 - c. Look into ways to address transportation concerns and access to services.
- C. Schedule an annual report presentation with City Council for a date in August or September. If additional funding is desired for the next fiscal year, this needs to be brought to City Administration's attention by November.
