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



Fence Materials for 303 N. 3rd Ave, St. Charles, IL 60174

Fence will be 5' high and will be about 67' linear feet. There will be one single doored matching gate.

We are using the screw-in post anchors, and attaching the 4x4 treated wood posts, then placing three 1x4" treated wood horizontals across them. We will then screw in 1x4" treated wood verticals across the posts. Fence top will be capped similar to the existing fence. Here is a picture of the fence we are trying to match up with:



We are doing the fence ourselves because we couldn't find any one to take a job that small. We built our last two fences so we are confident we can do it just as well as anyone else. Slower, but just as well. We have already had JULIE out to mark the location of no dig zones.
