

# Proclamation

## JACOB KADOLPH

- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** joined the Cub Scouts Pack 151 at Anderson Elementary School as a Tiger Cub at age 6. One of his favorite scouting events was the annual Pinewood Derby where his car won second place for speed in 2007. At age 11, he earned his Arrow of Light and crossed over to Boy Scout Troop 10 at St. Patrick's Church; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** held various positions including Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Troop Guide, Chaplain's Aide, Patrol Leader, and Troop Historian. He regularly participated in the Cathoree, a Catholic-based campout, and annual ski trips. Jacob completed 31 merit badges and received the Eagle Bronze and Gold Palms; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** truly enjoyed community service. For the past seven years, he participated in the Annual Walk to End Alzheimer's Disease in honor of his late grandmother, Patricia Ann Kadolph. He also volunteers at the Elgin Soup Kitchen, helping serve hot meals to homeless guests; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** is a senior at St. Charles North High School. A member of the Key Club, he represented the service organization as part of the Homecoming Court in his senior year. He was also inducted into the National Society of High School Scholars. His hobbies include boxing and reading about American History; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB'S** love for American History led to the development and completion of his Eagle Scout project. His project beneficiary was the Knights of Columbus — St. Charles Council No.12497 who saw a need within the community to honorably retire worn American flags. The flags were donated by parishioners from St. Patrick and St. John Neumann Churches. On August 20, 2016, with members of the Knights of Columbus and U. S. veterans in attendance, Jacob and Troop 10 honorably retired 850 American flags on the grounds of St. Patrick Church at Crane Road. The following day, the ashes were buried; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** would like to thank Robert Gilmartin, Project Beneficiary, Monsignor Stephen Knox of St. Patrick Church, Rev. David Peck of St. John Neumann Church, and David Jacobs, his Eagle Mentor, who were each instrumental in the success of the Eagle Project. Finally, he would like to thank his fellow scouts, Troop 10 leaders and committee members and his family for all their help and support; and
- WHEREAS,** **JACOB** has grown into a young man guided by his Catholic faith, the Scout Oath and Scout Law. He has met so many challenges head on, with courage and humility. With the values that Scouting has taught him, he plans to pursue a career in secondary education.
