Executive Summary:

The attached sample ordinance reflects guidelines established from surrounding communities that codify similar ordinances concerning salons and spas that allow for the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor in conjunction with the sale of services (as indicated) only. Staff researched this concept after being approached by a number of businesses that are seeking to offer the sale of alcoholic beverages as a compliment to salon/spa services. Staff has initiated the licensing process with one such business; "Agape Salon", but before doing so, is seeking some direction from the Liquor Commission. This information is being provided to foster some discussion amongst the Commission and to provide direction for staff moving forward. Other area communities with similar ordinances include: Batavia, Glen Ellyn, Hinsdale, Lincolnshire, and Park Ridge.

The yearly cost of this license would mirror that of Harley Davidson's "E" license.

Re: Proposed Liquor Classification for Mani/Pedi Salons

Listed below is a language sample for the proposed liquor classification for Mani/Pedi Salons.

Class D-9 Limited Retail/Salon-Spa License - \$500.00

Class D-9 licenses shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premise of a service business providing primarily salon, hairdresser, beautician, manicure, pedicure and/or barbershop services located in the appropriate zoning districts under the following conditions and limitations:

- a. Alcoholic liquor shall be sold only in conjunction with the sale of services (not products) and the licensee shall post a notice in a conspicuous place that alcoholic liquor may only be purchased in conjunction with a purchase of said services;
- b. If a salon/spa offers massage services as an ancillary service, alcoholic liquor shall not be allowed inside massage rooms;
- c. The retail sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors shall not take place between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. daily;
- d. The licensee shall be careful to comply with all other respects of our associated Alcoholic Beverages Code and the State of Illinois Liquor Code.
