






SCOPE OF WORK

- EXISTING GARAGE DOOR WAS HANGING BROKEN AT TOP AND NEEDED REPAIR IN ORDER TO CLOSE PROPERLY AND REDUCE FALL RISK. WORK PERFORMED INCLUDED REPLACING A BROKEN SPRING, REPLACING WHEEL GUIDES, BROKEN HINGES, AND DOOR JAM
- EXISTING DOOR WAS IN EXCESS OF 200 LBS AND POSED A SAFETY RISK, NEEDING IMMEDIATE REPAIR.
- IMMEDIA IE REPAIR.
