Title: Recommendation to Approve Governmental Agreements for the Proposed IL Route 64 Construction Project from 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Dunham Road

**Executive Summary:**

This work shall consist of the installation of storm sewers and respective structures, water main, valve vaults, installation of new public sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signal upgrades, pavement widening, replacement and installation of new curbing, and resurfacing of the pavement to accommodate a generally five-lane cross section. This work is anticipated to begin in March of 2012 and be completed by July of 2013. Payment of these costs to IDOT include three (3) equal payments over three years (no interest).

Governmental agreement will cover such items as:

1. Approval of Funding Resolution which outlines anticipated City costs include the breakdown of these costs as follows:
  - Water Distribution = \$907,500
  - Street Lighting = \$1,403,000
  - Traffic Signal Modernization and Emergency Vehicle Pre-emption Equipment = \$112,700
2. Modified traffic signal maintenance agreement. – This agreement outlines responsibilities for the maintenance of the traffic signals along the IL 64 corridor once the work is completed. This agreement indicates that IDOT will become the main point of contact for all future traffic signal repairs on IL 64.
3. Authorization for staff to sign plan approval sheet – This authorization will allow staff to sign the master cover sheet for the construction document acknowledging the approval of the plans and specifications prepared by IDOT.

### AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_ A.D, by and between the STATE OF ILLINOIS, acting by and through its DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION hereinafter called the STATE, and the CITY OF ST. CHARLES of the State of Illinois, hereinafter called the CITY.

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the STATE in order to facilitate the free flow of traffic and insure safety to the motoring public, is desirous of improving approximately 7,723 lineal feet (1.46 miles) of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road, as follows:

The improvement of IL Route 64 consists of 1,359 lineal feet of pavement reconstruction, 6,164 lineal feet of pavement widening, and resurfacing of the pavement to accommodate a five lane cross section with drainage improvements. The proposed lane widths consist of four through lanes (two in each direction) @ 12 feet, and a flush 12 feet and variable to 14 feet flush median. The flush median will provide for 12 feet in width dedicated left turn lanes at major intersections while providing a bi-directional left turn lane between intersections. Dedicated right turn lanes will be provided at Hunt Club Road (westbound only), and in both directions at North Tyler Road and Dunham Road. The existing roadway shoulder will be replaced with continuous combination concrete curb and gutter and a fully enclosed storm sewer system for roadway

drainage. Traffic signal modernization is proposed at the 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Tyler Road, and Dunham Road intersections including signal interconnection. Installing continuous highway lighting, constructing PCC sidewalks, utility adjustments including segments of water main replacement, and by performing all other work necessary to complete the improvement in accordance with the approved plans and specifications; and

WHEREAS, the CITY is desirous of said improvement in that same will be of immediate benefit to the CITY residents and permanent in nature;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The STATE agrees to make the surveys, obtain all necessary rights of way, prepare plans and specifications, receive bids and award the contract, furnish engineering inspection during construction and cause the improvement to be built in accordance with the approved plans, specifications and contract.
2. The STATE agrees to pay for all right of way, construction and engineering costs, subject to reimbursement by the CITY as hereinafter stipulated.
3. It is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the estimated cost and cost proration for this improvement is as shown on Exhibit A.
4. The CITY has passed a resolution appropriating sufficient funds to pay its share of the cost for this improvement, a copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit B" and made a part hereof.

The CITY further agrees that the CITY will reimburse the STATE to pay its share of the cost of said improvement in three annual installments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement and receipt of an invoice from the STATE which shall be based upon actual contract bid prices, the CITY will pay its first annual installment to the STATE in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the CITY, an amount equal to thirty three percent (33%) of its financial obligation incurred under this AGREEMENT. On or before April 1, 2013, the CITY will pay its second annual installment to the STATE in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the CITY, an amount equal to thirty three percent (33%) of its financial obligation incurred under this AGREEMENT. Upon receipt of a final invoice from the STATE and not before April 1, 2014, the CITY will pay to the STATE in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the CITY, an amount equal to the CITY's remaining financial obligation balance of construction and engineering costs. The aforementioned final invoice will be based upon actual final quantities multiplied by the actual contract unit bid prices plus engineering costs for all construction items in which the CITY has agreed to be financially responsible under the terms of this AGREEMENT.

The CITY further agrees to pass a supplemental resolution to provide necessary funds for its share of the cost of this improvement if the amount appropriated in "Exhibit B" proves to be insufficient, to cover said cost.

5. The CITY has adopted and will put into effect an appropriate ordinance, prior to the STATE's advertising for the proposed work to be performed hereunder, or shall continue to enforce an existing ordinance, requiring that parking be restricted within the limits of this improvement, a copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit C", and will in the future prohibit parking at such locations on or immediately adjacent to this

improvement as may be determined necessary by the STATE from traffic capacity studies.

6. The CITY has adopted and will put into effect an appropriate ordinance, prior to the STATE's advertising for the proposed work to be performed hereunder, or shall continue to enforce an existing ordinance, prohibiting the discharge of sanitary sewage and industrial waste water into any storm sewers constructed as a part of this improvement, a copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit D".
7. Prior to the STATE advertising for the work proposed hereunder, the disposition of encroachments will be cooperatively resolved with representatives from the CITY and the STATE.

The CITY has adopted and will put into effect an appropriate ordinance, prior to the STATE's advertising for the proposed work to be performed hereunder, or shall continue to enforce an existing ordinance, relative to the disposition of encroachments and prohibiting in the future, any new encroachments within the limits of the improvements, a copy of which is attached as "Exhibit E".

8. The CITY has adopted a resolution, will send a letter, or sign the Plan Approval page which is part of this document, prior to the STATE advertising for the work to be performed hereunder, approving the plans and specifications as prepared.
9. The CITY agrees not to permit driveway entrance openings to be made in the curb, as constructed, or the construction of additional entrances, private or commercial, along IL Route 64 without the consent of the STATE.

10. The CITY shall exercise its franchise rights to cause private utilities to be relocated, if required, at no expense to the STATE.
11. The CITY agrees to cause its utilities installed on right of way after said right of way was acquired by the STATE or installed within the limits of a roadway after the said roadway's jurisdiction was assumed by the STATE, to be relocated and/or adjusted, if required, at no expense to the STATE.
12. All CITY owned utilities, on STATE right of way within the limits of this improvement, which are to be relocated/adjusted under the terms of this Agreement, will be relocated/adjusted in accordance with the applicable portions of the "Accommodation of Utilities of Right of Way of the Illinois State Highway System." (92 Ill. Adm. Code 530).
13. The CITY agrees to obtain from the STATE an approved permit for any CITY owned utility adjusted/relocated as part of this improvement, and to abide by all conditions set forth therein.
14. Upon final field inspection of the improvement and so long as IL Route 64 is used as a STATE Highway, the STATE agrees to maintain or cause to be maintained the median, the through traffic lanes lying on either side of the median and the left-turn turn lanes and right turn lanes, each lane being 12 foot and variable in width and the curb and gutter stabilized shoulders and ditches adjacent to those traffic lanes and turn lanes. The STATE further agrees to maintain or caused to be maintained the highway lighting including furnishing the electrical energy thereof.

15. Upon final field inspection of the improvement, the CITY agrees to maintain or cause to be maintained those portions of the improvement which are not maintained by the STATE, including sidewalks, parkways, guardrails, crosswalk and stop-line markings, CITY owned utilities including appurtenances thereto, and shall maintain the storm sewers and appurtenances by performing those functions necessary to keep the sewer in a serviceable condition including cleaning sewer lines, inlets, manholes, and catch basins along with the repair or replacement of inlet, manhole and catch basins' frames, grates or lids. The maintenance, repair and/or reconstruction of storm sewers constructed as part of this improvement beyond the aforescribed responsibilities shall be that of the STATE.

The CITY further agrees to continue its existing maintenance responsibilities on all side road approaches under its jurisdiction, including all left and right turn lanes on said side road approaches, up to the through edge of pavement of IL Route 64.

Drainage facilities, if any, at the aforementioned side roads located within the STATE right-of-way shall be the joint maintenance responsibility of the STATE and the CITY unless there is an agreement specifying different responsibilities.

16. It is mutually agreed that the STATE and the CITY entered into a Master Traffic Signal Agreement on July 5, 2011. The Master Traffic Signal Agreement contained an Exhibit A which defined the maintenance and energy responsibilities of traffic control devices along STATE highways located within or near the CITY.

Upon completion of the improvement and acceptance by the STATE of the traffic signal modernization included herein, the maintenance of the following signals shall be reassigned from the CITY to the STATE:

- Illinois Route 64 (North Ave.) at Tyler Road
- Illinois Route 64 (North Ave.) at Dunham/Industrial Drive

The cost splits for the maintenance and energy shall remain as indicated in the July 5, 2011 Master Agreement. Exhibit A of the aforementioned Master Traffic Signal Agreement is revised and attached hereto as Exhibit F of this agreement.

Obligations of the STATE and CITY will cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or Federal funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for this contract.

This AGREEMENT and the covenants contained herein shall be null and void in the event the contract covering the construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within three years subsequent to execution of the agreement.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

FUNDING RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of St. Charles has entered into an AGREEMENT with the STATE OF ILLINOIS for the improvement of FAP Route 307 (Illinois Route 64), known as State Section: 129R-2; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the aforementioned AGREEMENT, it is necessary for the Village to appropriate sufficient funds to pay its share of the cost of said improvement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that there is hereby appropriated the sum of TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED FORTY SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED NINETY dollars (\$2,247,590) or so much thereof as may be necessary, from any money now or hereinafter allotted to the City to pay its share of the cost of this improvement as provided in the AGREEMENT; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City will reimburse the State to pay its share of the cost of said improvement in three annual installments. Upon award of the contract for this improvement and receipt of an invoice from the State which shall be based upon actual contract bid prices, the City will pay its first annual installment to the State in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the City, an amount equal to thirty three percent (33%) of its financial obligation incurred under this AGREEMENT. On or before April 1, 2013, the City will pay its second annual installment to the State in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the City, an amount equal to thirty three percent (33%) of its financial obligation incurred under this AGREEMENT. Upon receipt of a final invoice from the State and not before April 1, 2014, the City will pay to the STATE in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the City, an amount equal to the City's

remaining financial obligation balance of construction and engineering costs. The  
aforementioned final invoice will be based upon actual final quantities multiplied by the actual  
contract unit bid prices plus engineering costs for all construction items in which the City has  
agreed to be financially responsible under the terms of this AGREEMENT.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City agrees to pass a supplemental resolution to  
provide any necessary funds for its share of the cost of this improvement if the amount  
appropriated herein proves to be insufficient, to cover said cost.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois acting by and through its Department of Transportation is desirous of improving of approximately 7,723 lineal feet (1.46 miles) of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road, which lies within the CITY OF ST. CHARLES; and

WHEREAS, a portion of this project runs through the CITY OF ST. CHARLES; and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the free flow of traffic and ensure safety to the motoring public, the CITY OF ST. CHARLES determines that the parking along IL Route 64 shall be prohibited.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, COUNTY OF KANE, STATE OF ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That parking shall be prohibited along of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road within the City limits of the CITY OF ST. CHARLES;

Section 2. That the CITY COUNCIL of the CITY OF ST. CHARLES will prohibit future parking at such locations on or immediately adjacent to IL Route 64 as may be determined and directed by the State of Illinois to be necessary to ensure the free flow of traffic and safety to the motoring public.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois acting by and through its Department of Transportation, is desirous of improving approximately 7,723 lineal feet (1.46 miles) of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road, within the City limits of the CITY OF ST. CHARLES; and

WHEREAS, said project includes the installation of storm sewers, sanitary sewers, and drainage facilities; and

WHEREAS, the project runs through the CITY OF ST. CHARLES including the installation of storm drains and drainage facilities;

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ENCROACHMENTS  
WITHIN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS RIGHT OF  
WAY ALONG FAP 307 - IL Route 64

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois acting by and through its Department of Transportation, is desirous of improving approximately 7,723 lineal feet (1.46 miles) of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road in the CITY OF ST. CHARLES ; and

WHEREAS, said project is being constructed in order to facilitate the free flow of traffic and ensure safety to the motoring public; and

WHEREAS, said project passes through the CITY OF ST. CHARLES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, COUNTY OF KANE, STATE OF ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That no person, firm, corporation or other entity shall install, place, maintain or construct any structure that encroaches upon the State of Illinois right of way of IL Route 64, (FAP Route 307), STATE Section 129R-2, State Job Number: C-91-184-01, from east of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue easterly to west of Dunham Road within the limits of the CITY OF ST. CHARLES.
