Balance of Youth Commission funds \$325 to be given to St. Charles North High School National Honor Society for “Kohl’s for Kids Project.”

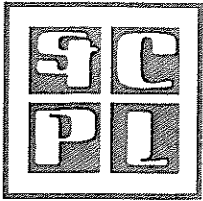

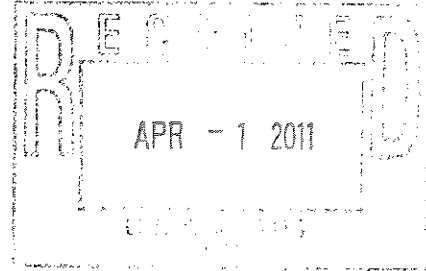

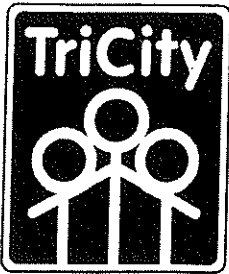

## Sample letter to Churches

Dear Parents and Church Families--

Spring is upon us, bringing with it so many wonderful Celebrations. For our young people, these include **prom, graduation, and graduation parties**. Unfortunately, these times of joy and celebration far too often include tragedy. How many of us know of a young person lost to us because of an alcohol related accident. What can we do? We can remember WE are the parents; WE are the ones entrusted with the care and protection of our children; WE are the front line defense in keeping our children, our most precious assets and hopes for the future, safe from totally preventable tragedy. PLEASE know the truth behind "Parents who Host--Lose the Most." Legal ramifications aside, and we know they are formidable, we cannot stand by and make no attempt to protect our young people. Parties need to be chaperoned and alcohol free. Our children need to see that we care enough and love them enough to establish boundaries. Please work with others in our community, other parents, to promote a joyous celebratory end of the year.
