Mayor DeWitte stated the following:

Since 2008, the like many communities and municipalities in Illinois and across the country, City of St. Charles has experienced increased fiscal challenges. In St. Charles, we attribute the source of these challenges to two specific issues:

1. Our community is maturing, resulting in a decline in new development activity that expands the tax base and generates higher levels of revenue.
2. The continued sluggishness of our local and national economic conditions.

In March, 2010, the City Council expressed a need for an analysis of the City's "core competencies" and a desire to address, what many describe, as the structural deficiencies of our budget in a comprehensive fashion. The City of St. Charles developed the St. Charles Sustainability Initiative (SSI), a program that aligns directly with the vision of the City's strategic plan, and will result in a balanced, sustainable financial plan for the foreseeable future. The program was established to obtain input from a variety of stakeholders via a collaborative, open approach. In response, over 130 ideas and suggestions were submitted for consideration. Based on feedback received, the City Administrator and Department Directors will begin formulating plans for their implementation and will be formulating a strategy to reach fiscal sustainability moving forward. That will continue to be our focus during FY11-12.

Also since 2008, the City of St. Charles has taken careful steps to manage spending and implement other measures to address difficulties, resulting from the economic downturn.

The highest level of General Fund expenditures, which funds the majority of City services, occurred for FY2007-08 when the City expended \$42.7 million. The City's actual expenditure amount for the fiscal year ending April 30, 2010, this year, will be \$37.7 million, representing an

operating reduction of 12%. In addition during FY 2007-08, the City employed 352 full-time equivalent employees. This year, we project there will be 284 FTEs, representing a 19% decrease in our workforce.

These efforts have allowed us to maintain financial operational stability as confirmed by our continued unchanged Moody's bond rating of AA1. It has allowed us to avoid the more extreme steps that other communities have been required to take, such as drastic service reductions, employee layoffs, cancellation of traditional community festivals and events, and significant tax increases.

The adoption of the FY11-12 budget presented this evening represents a carefully crafted and collaboratively developed financial plan. I want to thank City Administrator Brian Townsend, all the department directors, my colleagues here on the City Council, and all of the residents of the community and employees of the organization who have contributed to this year's budget process. St. Charles is a community that is admired by our peers for the quality of services that we provide. We are also an organization that is respected for our proactive preparation, our resourceful responses, and implementation of best practice business principles. We should all take pride in these facts and realize how fortunate we all are.

The budget for FY 2011/2012 has two main themes.

1. We will maintain our commitment to service of the residents of St. Charles, and
2. We will continue to enhance the physical infrastructure of the community to meet future demands.

These themes are a testament to the City's ongoing efforts to fulfill the mission that is laid out in our community's strategic plan of preserving our heritage, fostering opportunity, building community, and enhancing quality of life for all. This budget plan being presented this evening will allow the City to continue those efforts. In the best interests of our residents, our business owners, and those who will choose to invest here.

You will recall this matter was brought before the planning and development committee last week where it was unanimously recommended for approval. However at the time there was no representatives from Sears present to answer questions, etc. They are here tonight. Sears would like to occupy space formerly occupied by Blockbuster, 5300 square feet.

The terms of reimbursement are such that the party is requesting a 50% reimbursement of their City's \$.01 sales tax for a period of five years. The estimated value of total is about \$20,000 a year based on \$2,000,000 estimated sales, so that the 50% would represent about \$10,000 a year in reimbursement. The total estimated tax from the \$2,000,000 in sales is \$40,000 to the City therefore this marks about 25% of their total tax to be reimbursed to Sears. There were a couple of conditions you recall. The Council recommended that until such time as Sears proves out \$1.6 million or more in sales there will be no reimbursement. At that point then all of those monies and beyond will be reimbursed at 50% until maxed out at \$10,000. Secondly, the total maximum for the five year period is to be \$50,000 in reimbursements.

Question about product mix, what do you find sells well in our area, what kinds of appliances?

Partial to Kenmore but other brands are Samsung, LG, Whirlpool and Maytag line. We have washers and dryers. The store format has all major appliances including all your cooking appliances, refrigeration, and food storage. We hope to introduce some small kitchen appliances as well.

Alder. Penny

I have a docking question. If you order the item at your store and it is delivered to your home is that correct. Would people be taking things from that location?

Brandon Garten

Typically not, but that could occur. Most of the time we would use Sears home delivery. But if someone buys a close out or vacuum cleaner or bags, they would carry it out.

Mayor DeWitte

Thanks for coming out this evening. I am glad to have Sears back in St. Charles as one of our business partners. So welcome and wish you the best.
