OLD BUSINESS

Electric Light Parade participation by YC has been shelved. Parade coordinators required insurance. Since money was not budgeted by YC, Nancy recommends waiting until next year.

Nancy laminated “Anti-Text” posters of St. Charles Youth Commission Logo. Nancy started discussion regarding budgeting some money every year for community outreach programs (Parents Who Host the Most, Anti-Text, Any other campaigns in the future). Chief Lamkin wants to split costs to put Anti-Text posters in school.

If we budget money for outreach and we have money left at the end of the fiscal year, then we can donate to organizations requesting grants that help youth.

Scarecrow Festival – Nancy was very pleased with visitors’ response to “Parents Who Host, Lose the Most” poster. Nancy recommends going for marquee again for more exposure – kids are on vacation on holiday break.

Idea regarding “Thumb Rings” in schools with Anti-Text message. Possibly partnering with school groups? Possibly a challenge grant idea? Perhaps a good idea for Student Council or Hearts of Hope.

NEW BUSINESS

“Suburban Life Publications Advertising”. Soliciting for advertising in paper. Nancy does not feel spending YC budget money for ad space is appropriate. Consensus from commissioners is to not spend money on this.

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“St. Patrick’s Day Parade”, Spring 2012. Nancy says we have time to plan. No expense involved with this parade! Can walk or ride with St. Charles Youth Commission signs. Nancy and some commissioners agree that it is something to pursue. Mary Ann adds that any promotion should highlight a cause, not ourselves. Nancy will start exploring details.

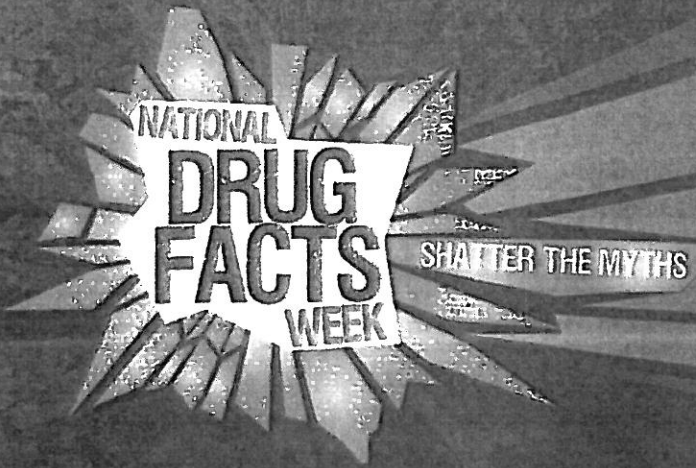

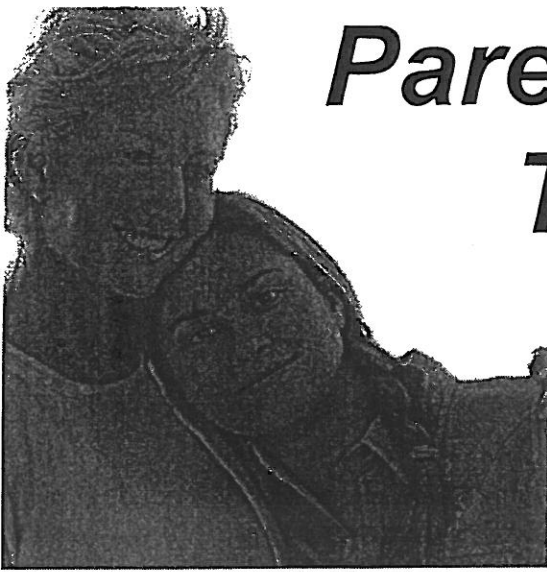

mindful emotions

Mindful Emotions is a solution focused, cognitive, behavioral, skills training group. With the support of their peers, participants develop skills for using mindfulness, positive feeling expression and healthy coping strategies.

This group is designed to help girls become more aware of their emotions. With that awareness, the girls learn techniques to cope with emotions that can be uncomfortable. With the support of the group, the girls also practice expressing their emotions appropriately.

— how does the program work?

This workshop is offered in 8 sessions for an hour and a half each. The overall goal of this workshop is to create an enhanced sense of emotional balance, build self-esteem, and develop a strong inner core.

Past participants said the most significant "take away" from this group experience was:

"That I learned how to cope with my own emotions and find a better way to deal with the problems/struggles in my life."

"How to control my emotions & to accept myself."

"Standing up for myself, which I could never do before."

"Learning to love myself!"

The cost of the 8 session Mindful Emotions workshop is \$240. Advance registration is required. Fee reductions are available based on need.

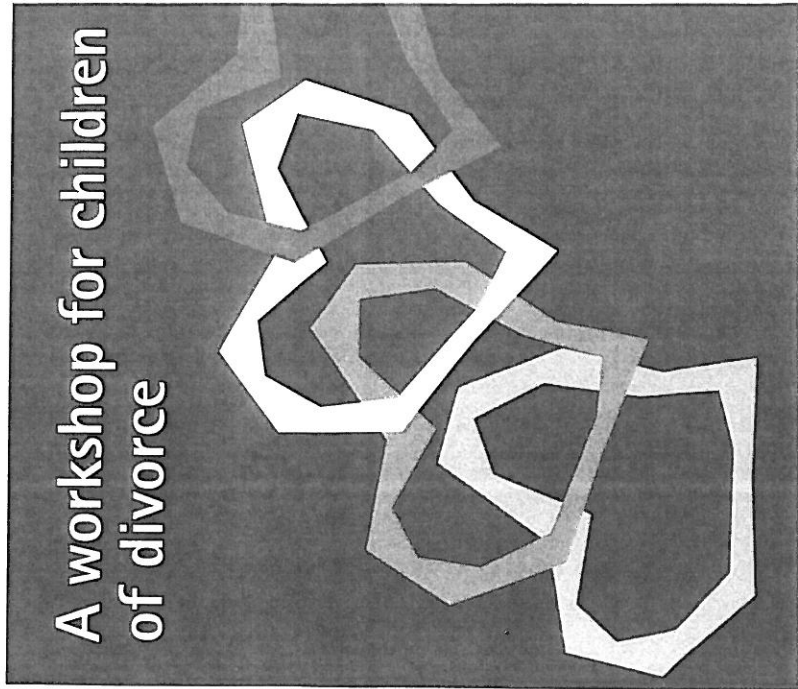

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bridges

—how does the program work?

—what about the kids?

Bridges is a workshop for children, ranging in age from 7 to 11, who are adjusting to their parents divorce or separation. The six-session workshop helps children in their struggle to cope with a changing family.

Bridges will help your child find the answers to commonly asked questions such as:

- Is there something strange about my family?
- Why is it happening? Is it my fault?
- How can I fix it? Will my parents get back together?
- Who can I talk to?

The workshop is 1 3/4 hours long and meets once a week for six consecutive weeks. The theme of each week's workshop will relate to the many different feelings that surround the child of divorce.

The group activities allow children to express themselves in a fun, safe, and comfortable environment. The six-week session includes one evening where parents are invited to attend and participate in an activity with their child—providing a good opportunity for conversation about the divorce.

The increased level of communication between parent and child about family matters, and the child's greater understanding of what divorce is and that they are not the cause, help to instill in the children a sense of comfort and control in their lives.

The **Bridges Workshop** will be facilitated by TriCity Family Services professionals. Cost for the program is \$75 for one child or \$125 for 2 or more children. Based on financial need, partial or full scholarships are available. For more information please contact TCFS at 630.232.1070.
