

Veterans of Foreign Wars Scholarship Competition

Voice of Democracy

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition in 1946. Knowing that a democratic society needs nurturing, the Veterans of Foreign Wars became a national sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. Many notables have participated in the Voice of Democracy including journalist Charles Kuralt, Miss America Anita Bryant and former U.S. Attorney General John Ashcroft.

The Voice of Democracy competition provides high school students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to write and record an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme, competing for more than \$2 million in college scholarships and incentives. Each first place Department (state) winner is brought to Washington, D.C. in March to enjoy our nation's capital and compete for \$152,000 in national college scholarships — first place receiving \$30,000.

This year's theme is, ***Is Our Constitution Still Relevant?***

The presenter of this year's recipient from St. Charles North High School is a member of our community, Ms. Merla Billquist, "1979 Voice of Democracy National Champion".

A small table is covered with a white cloth to honor a soldier's pure heart when he answers his country's call to duty.


A lemon slice and grains of salt are placed on a plate to show a captive soldier's bitter fate and tears of families waiting for loved ones to return.





I give my permission for my child _____, age _____, birth date _____, to attend the Chick Chat event on February 9, 2013 at Geneva Middle School North. The event is designed to aid youth in enhancing their social relationship skills and images of themselves as capable and competent individuals.

As a participant in the Chick Chat event, I acknowledge that I have been explained the risks and benefits of the program and have been provided the opportunity to ask questions. I further recognize that there are certain risks of physical injury, and I agree to assume the full risk of any injuries and damages which I or my child may sustain as a result of participating in any and all activities connected with the Chick Chat event. I agree to waive and relinquish all claims I or my child may have, as a result of participating in the event, against TriCity Family Services (TCFS), the Geneva Coalition for Youth, and Geneva CUSD 304 and their officers, agents, servants, employees, and volunteers for any injuries, damage, or loss which may occur to me or my child on account of my child's participation in the program. I further agree to indemnify and hold harmless and defend TriCity Family Services, the Geneva Coalition for Youth, and Geneva CUSD 304 and its officers, agents, servants, employees, and volunteers from any and all claims sustained by me or my child, arising out of, connected with, or in any way associated with the activities of the program including, but not limited to, the participation of my daughter in the physical challenges of the team building activities in the Chick Chat Challenge portion of the event and the yoga portion of the event.

My signature acknowledges that my child and I have not been pressured or forced to participate in the Chick Chat event. I have also been informed that my child and I will not be pressured into participating in any event or activity while she is a participant in the event. My child, as a girl participating in the Chick Chat event, will be encouraged to inform staff or volunteers if she feels unprepared or uncomfortable while involved in activities. If staff guidance and support does not enable her to face her fear or discomfort, she will be allowed to withdraw from that activity. I also recognize that she will be withdrawn from the event if TriCity Family Services facilitators feel that she poses a risk to the safety or well being of the participants in the Chick Chat event. If it would become necessary for my child to exit the event for any reason, I/ we will arrange to pick up and transport her from the Geneva Middle School North. If it becomes necessary for her to exit the event for any reason, TriCity Family Services staff will make every effort to assist her in making an orderly exit from the event.

In the event of an emergency and TCFS is unable to reach me, I authorize Chick Chat event staff and volunteers from TriCity Family Services, the Geneva Coalition for Youth, and Geneva CUSD 304, to administer first aid to my child and to secure from any accredited hospital and/or physician any treatment deemed necessary for the immediate care of my minor child and agree that I will be responsible for payment for any and all medical services rendered.

The information presented at Chick Chat is provided as a service to the community. The information shared is not intended to serve as, or substitute for professional counseling. All information shared by the girls participating in Chick Chat will be kept confidential by all TriCity Family Services personnel unless matters which indicate possible harm to or by a participant are revealed. All Chick Chat event staff and volunteers are mandated reporters. Confidentiality among the girls participating in Chick Chat will be encouraged but cannot be guaranteed.
