ANNOUNCEMENTS –

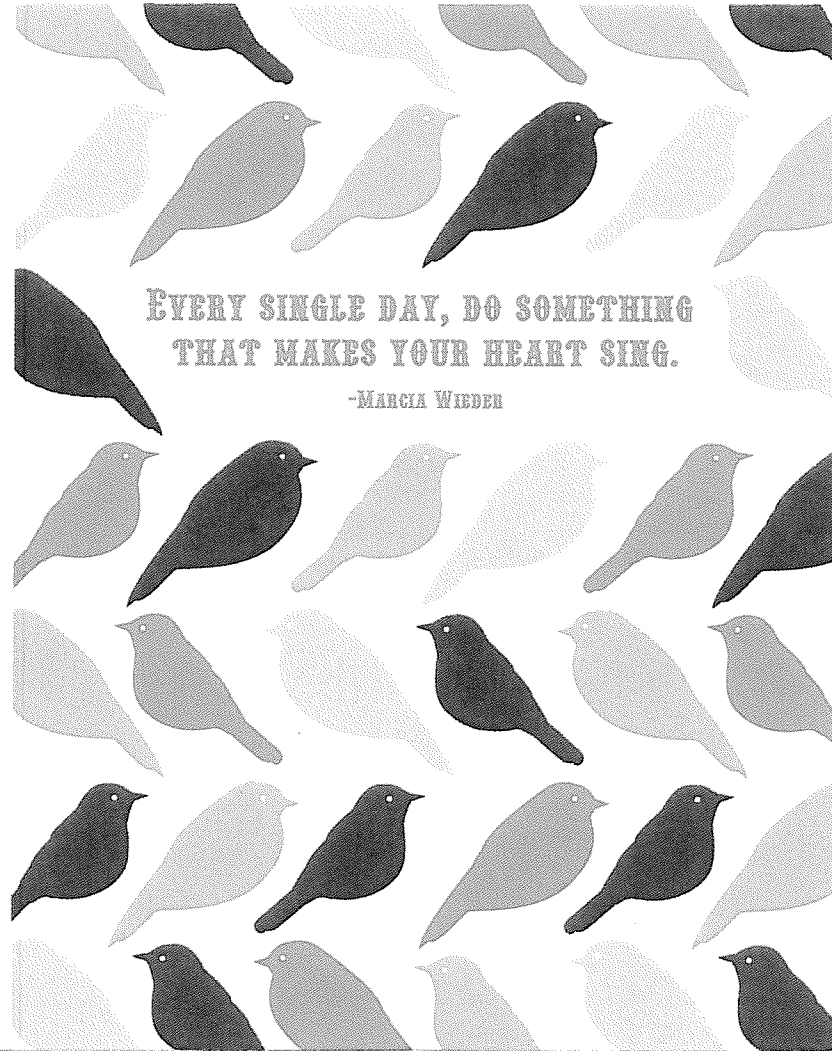
- Bill Tynan reminded us that Citizens Police Academy is upcoming.

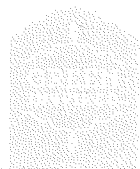

Dear St. Charles Youth Commission,

Last year, the St. Charles North Scholar Athletes completed a proposal for a grant to be awarded to help pay for training in Bullying Prevention. As you may recall, you graciously awarded us with money to complete this training. This spring two sophomore and junior student athletes from each team at North High School will be educated in ways to enhance leadership skills and recognize and prevent instances of hazing and bullying. The students receiving this training will then train the middle school athletes regarding these same skills next fall. Next spring the student athletes at Haines and North will run a pilot program to train students in a variety of clubs and organizations in their respective schools. It is our hope and intention that during the Fall of 2014, students from East HS, Wredling, and Thompson will obtain the training as well to make it a district-wide D303 commitment of athletes taking the responsibility of promoting leadership and educating their peers about strategies to prevent issues regarding hazing and bullying. Ideally, we want to bring this program to other schools in our conference and even lead it through the IHSA.

The initial training for this year will cost \$1,000 for four sessions involving over thirty SCN athletes. Again, we will then bring this training to Haines in the Fall, but we will need to pay for a facilitator to help organize and guide this training that will be led by the students. We anticipate the yearly cost to be under \$1,000 but it may change depending on the magnitude and success of the program.

Due to the growth plan of this program, we are asking the Youth Commission to consider donating funds that may be available to our program for use in its future facilitation. We understand that sometimes funds are more available some years than others and are respectfully asking that you consider donating to this cause again this year so we can continue to spread awareness about these topics. We are partnering with the athletic department as well in order to offset the cost of future training, but additional funds will need to be obtained through fundraising.
