COMPLAINT OF VIOLATION

NOW COMES the Petitioner, James Keegan, Chief of Police of the City of St. Charles, Illinois and files this complaint before the Local Liquor Control Commission of the City of St. Charles, Illinois, and states as follows:

- 1. The Petitioner is the duly appointed Chief of Police of the City of St. Charles and as such is charged with the duty of enforcing the laws of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the City of St. Charles.
- 2. On or about October 30, 2015, at approximately 2:11 a.m., the Licensee, A' Salute Lounge and Grill, by and through its employees, officers and/or agents, committed the following offense in or upon the licensed premises at 2400 East Main Street, St. Charles, IL 60174:

OFFENSE (AFTER HOURS OCCUPANCY)

Allowed persons who were not employees of the Licensee, to remain on or about the licensed premises after 2:00 a.m.

3. On or about October 30, 2015, A' Salute Lounge and Grill was operating under a Class C liquor license issued by the City of St. Charles.

- 4. That the acts detailed in Section 2 of this Complaint of Violation each are prohibited and are in violation of and contrary to Section 5.08.250 O, 1 of the St. Charles Municipal Code and the Liquor Control Act of 1934.
- 5. That the Licensee, A' Salute Lounge and Grill, is responsible for the acts of its employees, officers, agents and patrons and is required to ensure that no violations of state law or ordinances of the City of St. Charles take place on or about said premises.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioner, James Keegan, Chief of Police requests pursuant to Section 5.08.320 of the St. Charles Municipal Code that the Local Liquor Control Commission hold a hearing on this matter and take such action against A' Salute Lounge and Grill as the Commissioner shall deem appropriate under the circumstances.

On 103015 at 0211 Ofc. Mijal #372 and I arrived on scene of a check the well being call at A' Salute CR#15-24112. The call in that case was that a female subject () was in the bar, high intoxicated, and being taken advantage of by a male subject. That call was dispatched at 0207. As we arrived on scene I could see people inside the establishment which closed at 0200. As we approached the front door I observed a male subject heavier set with a black shirt with blue jeans on () make his way towards the back door with two subject exiting via the back door ahead of him (later identified by Ofc. Devol as Gus Donzelli). As we walked up to the front entry a male subject exited the front door wearing a white sox jacket. There were two patrons outside the front door and we made our way inside to check on the reported female being taken advantage of.

As we entered the bar I noticed 3 glasses with liquid still in them on a couple center tables away from the bar that had not been picked up yet, As I looked at the bar I could see several empty glasses on top of the bar along with at least one half full glass. I also noted that there were two completely full one yellow liquid, one orange liquid with fresh ice and straws on the top of the bar as well. Note - Once inside the bar there were still 5 subjects within (Bartender - , Bartender - , Bar Back - , Server -)

Ofc. Mijal spoke with one subject about the girl and I asked the bartender about why there were people in the bar after closing time. told me that they were busy and they tried to get everyone out. I explained that it wasn't an excuse for people to still be in the bar. then offered up the excuse that they had new servers and they didn't know better so people weren't moved out fast enough. I wasn't able to ask at that time about the two (full to the brim) drinks that were sitting on the bar top, as I went outside to speak to the male subject (wearing the black shirt who went to the back door as we walked up) heading to his vehicle to leave.

I spoke with that male subject identified as and he told me he was not an employee. I asked him while he was inside the bar after closing and he said he was just a patron. While speaking to a second male subject () who was inside as we entered walked up to our location and I asked if he was an employee. That subject identified as told me he works at the bar part time. I asked if he was working tonight. told me he was not. I clarified with that he was not working or getting paid to work (not inside cleaning or helping to close up the bar). confirmed again that he was not working this evening. that tonight he was simply a patron and therefore should not have been inside after closing. I asked the guy with the white sox jacket on and he told me he didn't know who he was; telling me he was just a patron. After obtaining contact information from I returned inside where the two full drinks and other glasses were now removed from the bar top and tables. I did observe taking them down from the bar while walking back towards the bar.

I asked about the drinks and told me they were just drinks that were brought up to the bar at closing time. told me that they must have been drinks that someone bought and simply didn't drink. I explained to that the glasses had fresh full ice cubes and were filled to the brim still. I explained to that it was highly unlikely that someone would order drinks and not even drink part of them. claimed that someone must have been milking the drinks, that she didn't make any drinks after 0200.

Ofc. Mijal confirmed the female subject in question (was helped home by the owner who was stopped out back by Ofc. Devol. Once we addressed the reason we were called to the business I explained to the that I would writing a report to document the fact that we had a complaint of a subject in the bar after 0200. That on our arrival at 0211 there were several subjects still inside who were not employees and there were drinks on the bar top that appeared to be freshly made full drinks; one orange, and the other yellow in color that were definitely not water. told me she understood and told me that the bar has not been in trouble since becoming A' Salute. did bring up the fact that she remembers when they got caught when it was Eastside Pub (her having been the bartender at that time).

When going to clear I witnessed go back up to the closed and locked front door. was let back inside the bar at 0237 by I made sure to have exit the business again. On our way out of the parking lot we did come across the original complainant from 15-24112, confirmed that he called after the bar was closed and that his date was inside the bar after closing time.

After getting a cab ride home I observed Donzelli pull up to the front of the business. I made contact with Donzelli and informing him that I would be writing a report to document the after hours occupancy violation of ordinance 5-08-250(O). Donzelli argued that some of that the people inside were employees. I explained to Donzelli that employees who are not working or not on shift don't count as employees when it comes to after hours occupancy. I also explained that I had regular patrons inside the business after hours as well. I told Donzelli that I was not writing a ticket, that I was simply writing a report that would go to the liquor commission for their review. Donzelli told me he understood.

At this time I have no further information in regard to this incident, case closed no further action at this time.
