COMPLAINT OF VIOLATION

NOW COMES the Petitioner, James Keegan, Chief of Police of the City of St. Charles, Illinois and files this complaint before the Local Liquor Control Commission of the City of St. Charles, Illinois, and states as follows:

- 1. The Petitioner is the duly appointed Chief of Police of the City of St. Charles and as such is charged with the duty of enforcing the laws of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the City of St. Charles.
- 2. On or about October 20, 2015, at approximately 2:40 a.m., the Licensee, The Stavi-Werks, Inc., d/b/a The House Pub, by and through its employees, officers and/or agents, committed the following offense in or upon the licensed premises at 16 S. Riverside Avenue, St. Charles, IL 60174:

FIRST OFFENSE (AFTER HOURS OCCUPANCY)

Allowed persons who were not employees of the Licensee, to remain on or about the licensed premises after 2:00 a.m.

SECOND OFFENSE (PROHIBITED SALE)

Sold, gave, delivered or allowed the consumption of liquor to an intoxicated person.

- 3. On or about October 20, 2015, The Stavi-Werks, Inc., d/b/a The House Pub was operating under a Class C liquor license issued by the City of St. Charles.
- 4. That the acts detailed in Section 2 of this Complaint of Violation each are prohibited and are in violation of and contrary to Section 5.08.250 O, 1 and Section 5.08.250 S, 1 of the St. Charles Municipal Code and the Liquor Control Act of 1934.
- 5. That the Licensee, The Stavi-Werks, Inc., d/b/a The House Pub, is responsible for the acts of its employees, officers, agents and patrons and is required to ensure that no violations of state law or ordinances of the City of St. Charles take place on or about said premises.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioner, James Keegan, Chief of Police requests pursuant to Section 5.08.320 of the St. Charles Municipal Code that the Local Liquor Control Commission hold a hearing on this matter and take such action against The Stavi-Werks, Inc., d/b/a The House Pub as the Commissioner shall deem appropriate under the circumstances.

On 102015 at 0240 hrs I was dispatched to The House Pub (16 S Riverside Ave) for a report of subjects still inside and consuming alcohol. Sgt Bedell and Ofc Burden also responded to the scene. Upon arrival I observed the complainant, standing inside the doorway. I went to the window to look inside the bar. From my position, I could see all of the bar stools were up on the bar. I could see 2 small glasses with an unknown liquid inside of them on the bar top. One glass was in front of a subject standing behind the bar now known as Stephen Erd. There was another subject behind the bar now known as There was a male subject standing by the bar and he was identified as

When I knocked on the glass, they just looked at me. and came to the front door when I knocked a second time. I advised them that I was coming inside to inspect the business. When I entered, I observed 2 male subjects sitting on the steps that lead to the 2nd level. They were identified as and . There was another male who was standing on the second floor leaning on the rail. He was identified as

I asked who was in charge of the bar and advised me that he was the bartender so he would be. I advised him that I received a complaint of people in the bar after hours and consuming alcohol. He stated that they were just cleaning up the place. I asked him if everyone was employees and he stated Stephen was the owner, and was an employee. I was then advised that , and were in a band and they played there tonight. I also noticed that the glasses were now empty.

I then asked about who was standing outside. They advised me that they kicked him out around 0145-0150 hours. He was so drunk that he threw up in the street. I advised that if they weren't employees they would need to leave. They then advised that the subject outside had become unruly and they were waiting for him to leave. They were advised that they should have called us if there was any problems.

I then went outside to speak to

He stated that while he was in the bar, a group of subjects stated he wasn't worthy of drinking with them. He advised them that he could drink with anyone. He and the owner then started a drinking contest. They started slamming shots of Crown Royal. He stated that he obviously lost because he puked in the street. He then pointed to a pile of vomit (obvious smell of vomit permeated the air). He further advised us that he didn't know the subjects before tonight and this was only his second time being at The House Pub.

I asked how he was going to get home and he advised UBER. He then stated that he was going to stay at the Hotel Baker. I offered to call him a cab but he declined.

At this point the group exited the bar. Stephen was obviously intoxicated. He was staggering as he walked and had slurred speech. Ofc Burden asked Stephen how he was getting home. He stated his friends would drive him and that he knows not to drive like this. His friends provided him with a ride home.

This report will be given to the liquor commission for possible liquor law violations.
